Summer

Personal, Social and Emotional Development



Regulate their behaviour.

Give focused attention to what the teacher says.

Be confident to try new activities and show independence, resilience and perseverance.

Communication and Language

Respond to what they hear with relevant questions.



Clarify their understanding through discussion

Hold conversations and engaged in back-and-forth exchanges.

Physical Development

Move energetically, such as running, jumping, dancing, hopping, skipping and climbing.



Demonstrate strength, balance and coordination.

Use a range of small tools, including scissors, paint brushes and cutlery effectively.

Literacy



Use and understand recently introduced vocabulary during discussions about stories, non-fiction, rhymes and poems.

Read aloud simple sentences and books that are consistent with their phonic knowledge, including some common exception words.

Write simple phrases and sentences that can be read by themselves and other.

Mathematics



Automatically recall (without reference to rhymes, counting or other aids) number bonds up to 5 (including subtraction facts) and some number bonds to 10, including double facts.

Verbally count beyond 20, recognising the pattern in numbers.

Recognise and talk about the properties of simple 2d and 3d shapes.

Understanding the World



Understand the past through settings, characters and events encountered in books read in class and storytelling.

Explain some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries.

Understand some important processes and changes in the natural world around them,



Expressive Arts and Design



Share their creations, explaining the process they have used.

Safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form, and function.

Perform songs, rhymes, poems and stories with others.
