SHINE- PARENT AND CARER FEEDBACK SESSION

We would like to invite all parents and carers to an open morning feedback session on **24th January from 9.00am until 10.30am**. We have been approached by "Shine Lincolnshire" who have asked us to support them with research that they are currently carrying out.

Shine Lincolnshire is working with LCC and LPFT to support the Community Asset Workstream of the CYP Mental Health Review and Transformation Programme; who will be responsible for taking forward the transformation of our Mental Health support services for Children and Young People in Lincolnshire.

During these sessions, parent and cares are invited to discuss and feedback their views on issues including:

- •What are the barriers to accessing community support
- •What are the gaps in community provision to support parents and carers in their physical and mental wellbeing
- •What does existing community provision look like to them
- •What services and facilities do they feel is missing in their community that would have a positive impact on their wellbeing

The aim of the review is to assist in the planning and development of community-based wellbeing activities to act as a prevention and early intervention pathway and undertake consultation with the sector, children, young people and their families to establish how and where community services can enhance the wellbeing of Children and Young People across Lincolnshire.

As part of the review, we are looking to gain an understanding of what is needed to transform services by **directly listening to Children and Young People, professionals and parent/carers** to help design what services need to look like going forward and create a clear transformation plan based on the feedback of those delivering and using community provision.

Shine Lincolnshire are looking to hear from families to **ensure co-production is at the core of the Transformation Programme** through a survey. Should you not be able to make the meeting, please do complete the feedback form below:
